

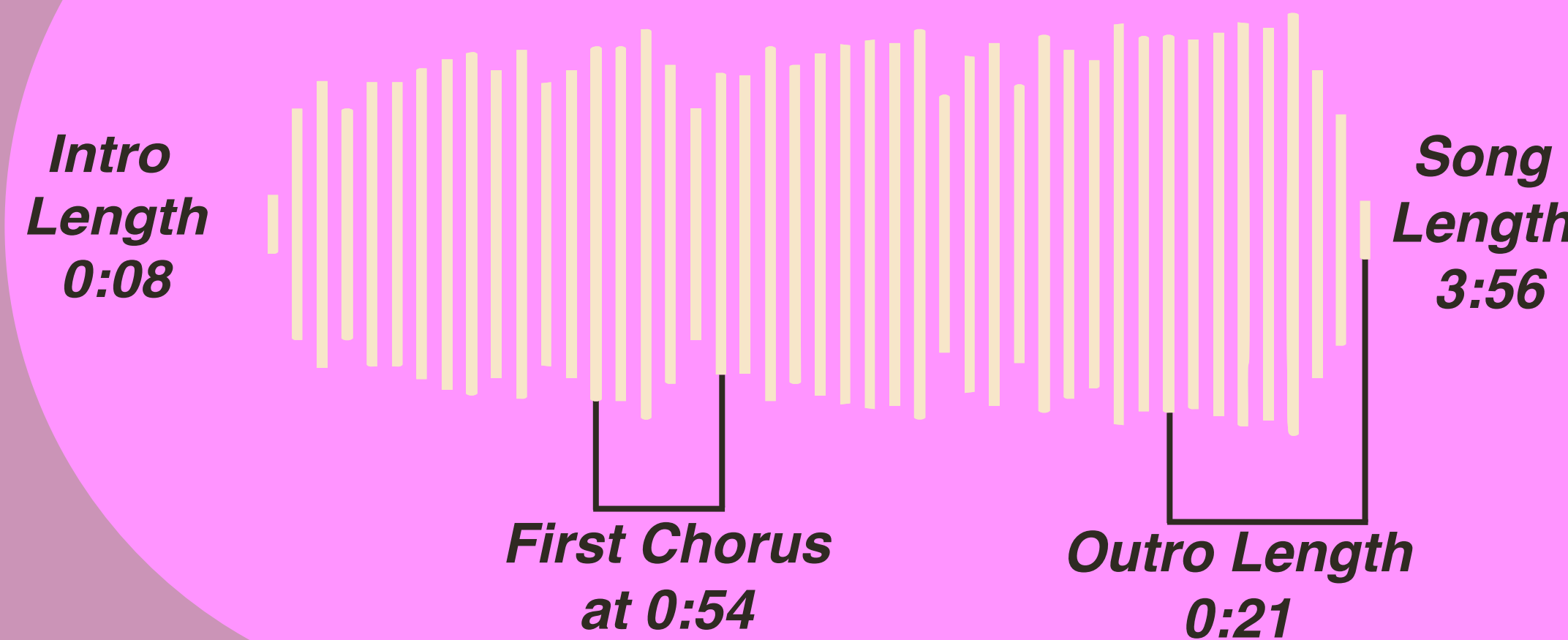
Anatomy of A song

Structure of a Song

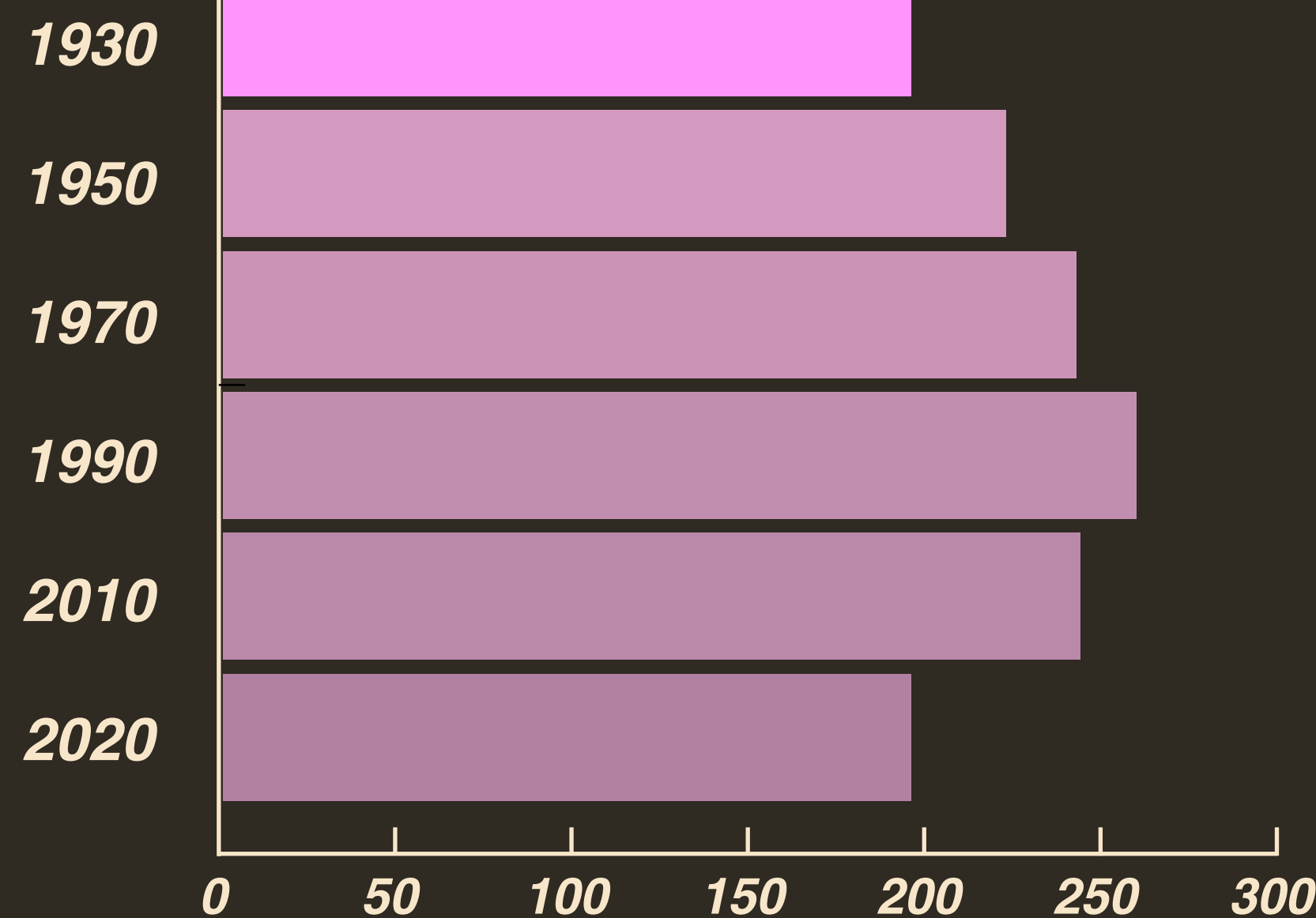
California Gurls - Katy Perry

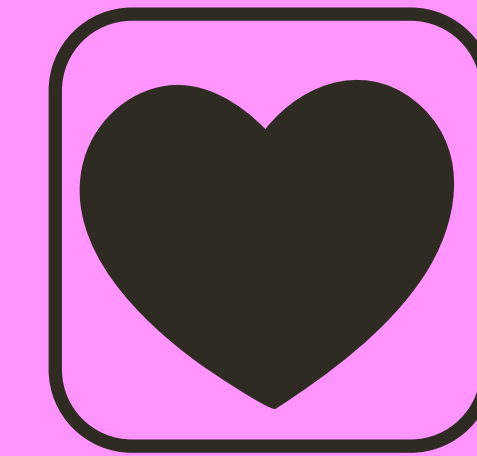
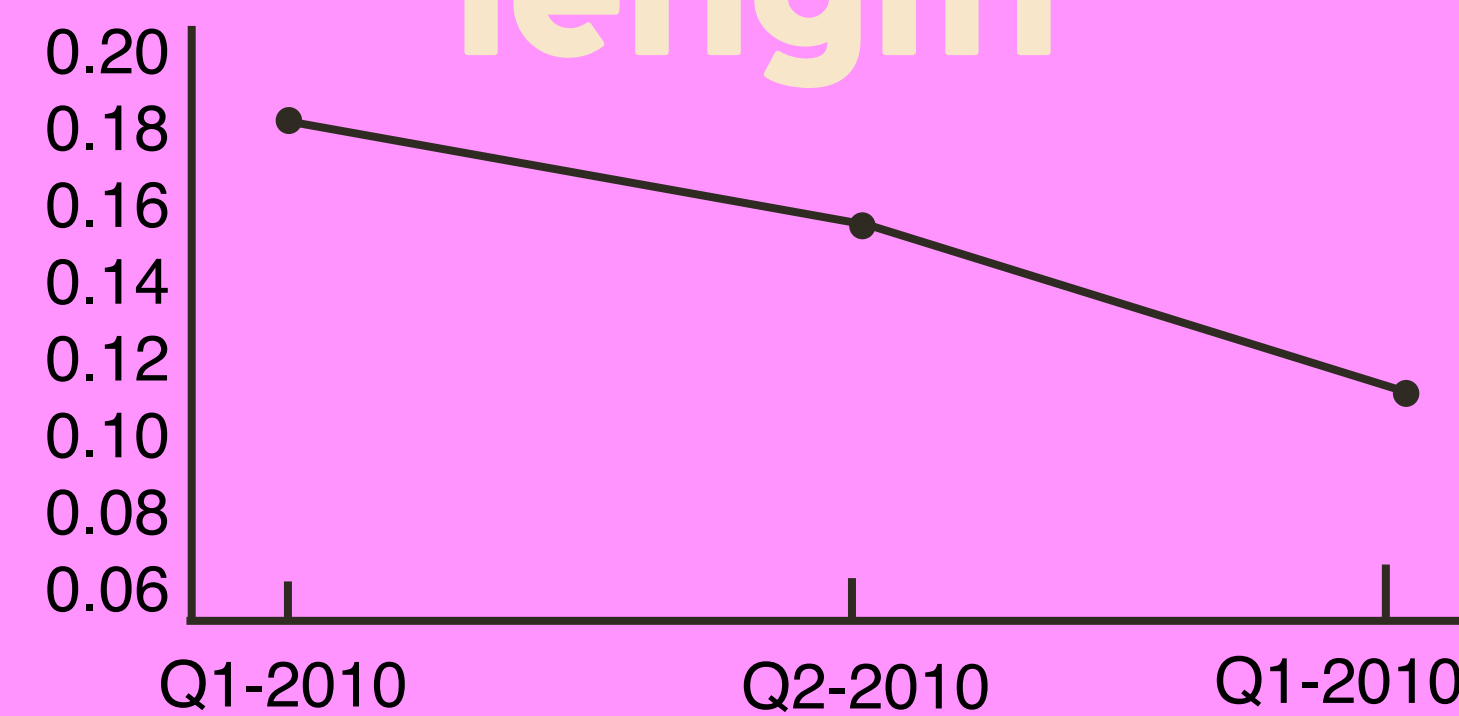
Mean song duration by the year (in seconds)



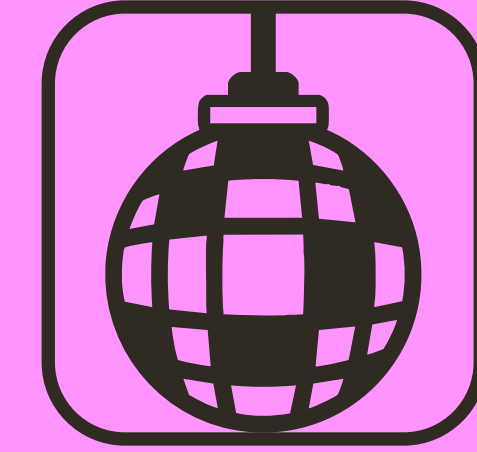
Average song length



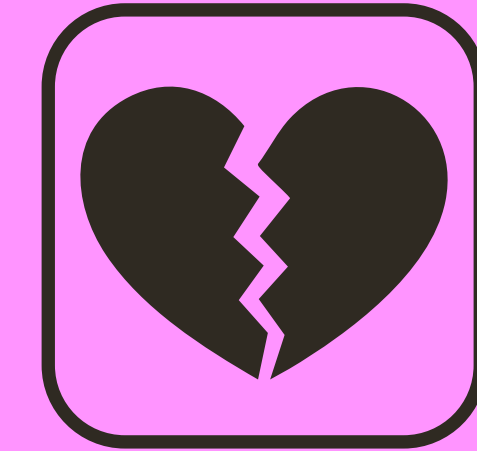
Average intro length
